A seasoned entertainer, Kathy's performance years began over 40 years ago, through competition and solo recital performances. After graduation from Withrow High School, she completed her Bachelor of Arts at Xavier University/Edgecliff College with a degree in Sociology. While continuing her performance career, Kathy completed her Master of Arts in Arts Administration from the College-Conservatory of Music, University of Cincinnati.

Kathy tours throughout the **United States**, **Canada**, **Europe** and **Caribbean** and worked with **LensCrafters** *Give the Gift of Sight* **International Program**, **Tunisia**, **North Africa**. Kathy's recordings include "You Got the Magic", "J Curve Cincinnati Jazz Collection, Vol. II", "The Next Noel", and upcoming release "Kathy Wade" and single "Someone's In Love". The video counterpart to "Someone's In Love" has received an **EMMY**®, a **TELLY**, three **International Films and Television Awards** and featured in "Cincinnati - The Movie".

(LTA), a 501(c)(3) non-profit performing arts educational organization. LTA provides quality performing arts programs in support of arts integrated education, literacy, community development and engagement encouraging multi-cultural awareness and understanding. LTA is the presenting organization for the *Kids, Cultures, Critters and Crafts Festival; Crown Jewels of Jazz®, Arts Over ACEs® Center* and the regional Emmy® and national award-winning, *Books Alive! For Kids*®. LTA's Mosaic Edutainment programs include *Black Anthology of Music, Rhythms...*Common Bonds, *The High School 'Hood Is Bigger Than You Think*® Tour and *Textural Rhythms: Hear the Touch*. LTA presents programs to over 1.1 million participants throughout the country.

Kathy, an author, (Building People: Social-Emotional Learning for Kids, Families, Schools and Communities, 2018), is the recipient of the 2020 Urban League of Greater Southwest Ohio Lion, 4C Champion for Children, 2019 People's Liberty Grant, Medical Mutual Pillar Awards for Community Service Non-Profit Executive of the Year; Cincinnati Human Relations Commission Connecting Communities and Culture Award; Cincinnati USA Convention and Visitor's Bureau Wendell P.
