This group, with its killer horn section, goes on to become one of Cincinnati's premiere bands for the next decade. As the alumni prepare for their 30th high school reunion, the committee realizes that a DJ playing CD's for a crowd accustomed to live music was not going to work and the idea of a BlueStone Ivory reunion was born.
